

Warren A. Leger passed away at the Sawtelle Family Hospice House in Reading, on Sunday April 7, 2013, at the age 85. Mr. Leger was born in Stoneham on February 28, 1928 to the late Ernest F. & Marjorie (Patrick) Leger. He was raised in Melrose, attended Melrose Schools before entering WWII. Many years later he would receive his high school diploma with several other soldiers from WWII. Warren served his country proudly under General Douglas McArthur during the occupation of Japan after the atomic bomb was dropped. He served as a private first class with the 3186 Signal Service Battalion setting up communications in Okinawa. After his return from Japan, Mr. Leger worked at

the General Electric River Works in Lynn for 40 years; assembling turning gears used in the propulsion systems on numerous US Navy ships and submarines. As a lifelong resident of Melrose, Warren was very involved in the Melrose community, especially with various veterans groups.
